I GENERAL MEDIA INFORMATION

Welcome to the 9th EHF FINAL4 Women in Budapest. Through the media information services we will keep you up to date with all news and provide resources for your coverage.

Accreditations

You can pick up your accreditation in the accreditation centre. The accreditation centre is located at gate XI of MVM Dome (Üllői út 131, 1098 Budapest), just in front of the TV compound.

Opening hours of the accreditation centre are:

- Friday, 2 June 2023: 10:00-19:00
- Saturday, 3 June 2023: 10:00-19:00
- Sunday, 4 June 2023: 10:00-18:00

At the accreditation pick-up, you must present a copy of the accreditation email and a valid photo ID (e.g. passport or driving licence) in order to collect your accreditation.

Parking

Media parking spaces at the MVM Dome are limited and the requests will be handled by the organisers on a first-come-first-served basis, limited to a maximum of 25% of a company's total accredited staff.

Media representatives who would like to reserve a media parking space must contact presscentrehungary@gmail.com and specify the days for which parking space is required.

After the reservation, you will receive a PDF document that needs to be printed and presented to the security on the requested date. Different QR codes will be issued for each day, as each one of them is valid for one entry.

At the time of the event, access to the MVM Dome and the P1A parking lot reserved for media representative is only possible from Üllői street. The exact approach to the parking lot marked P1A and the details of the corresponding access route are clearly visible on the map on the parking ticket.

I GENERAL MEDIA INFORMATION

Media centre

Media centre will open its doors on Friday and remain open until Sunday. It will have an info desk, working area and catering area.

Opening hours of the media centre are:

- Sunday, 4 June 2023: 11:00-22:30

Catering

The media catering will be divided into two categories – snacks and hot meals.

Snacks will be available for free in the media centre during the day and will include hot and cold drinks, mini sandwiches, fruit and mini pastries.

Hot meals will also be available in the media catering area on Saturday and Sunday from 16:30 until 19:00. Hot meals must have been ordered in advance.

Media seating

Media seats will be located in sectors 202 and 203 on the second floor of the MVM Dome. Please note that media cannot book a position in the media tribune.

Photographers

Photographers can pick up their photo bibs from the info desk in the media centre. A small deposit (20€/6000 HUF) will be required on arrival from photographers to ensure the return of bibs after the event.

Photo positions are located behind the goals. Photographers must wear their accreditation and the bib to be able to access them. Photographers are requested to take their places in the photo positions ahead of the start of each game.

It is mandatory to remain seated during a match and it is forbidden to enter the field of play. Changing sides is only possible at half-time and it is forbidden to cross the field of play to do so: the adequate routing will be presented in the photo briefing.

If needed, a photo positions plan may be implemented. Please note that photographers cannot book or reserve a photo position. Priority will be given to the EHF photographers, major agencies, team photographers and national media of the teams playing.

Photo briefing will take place in the media centre at 14:00 on both Saturday and Sunday.

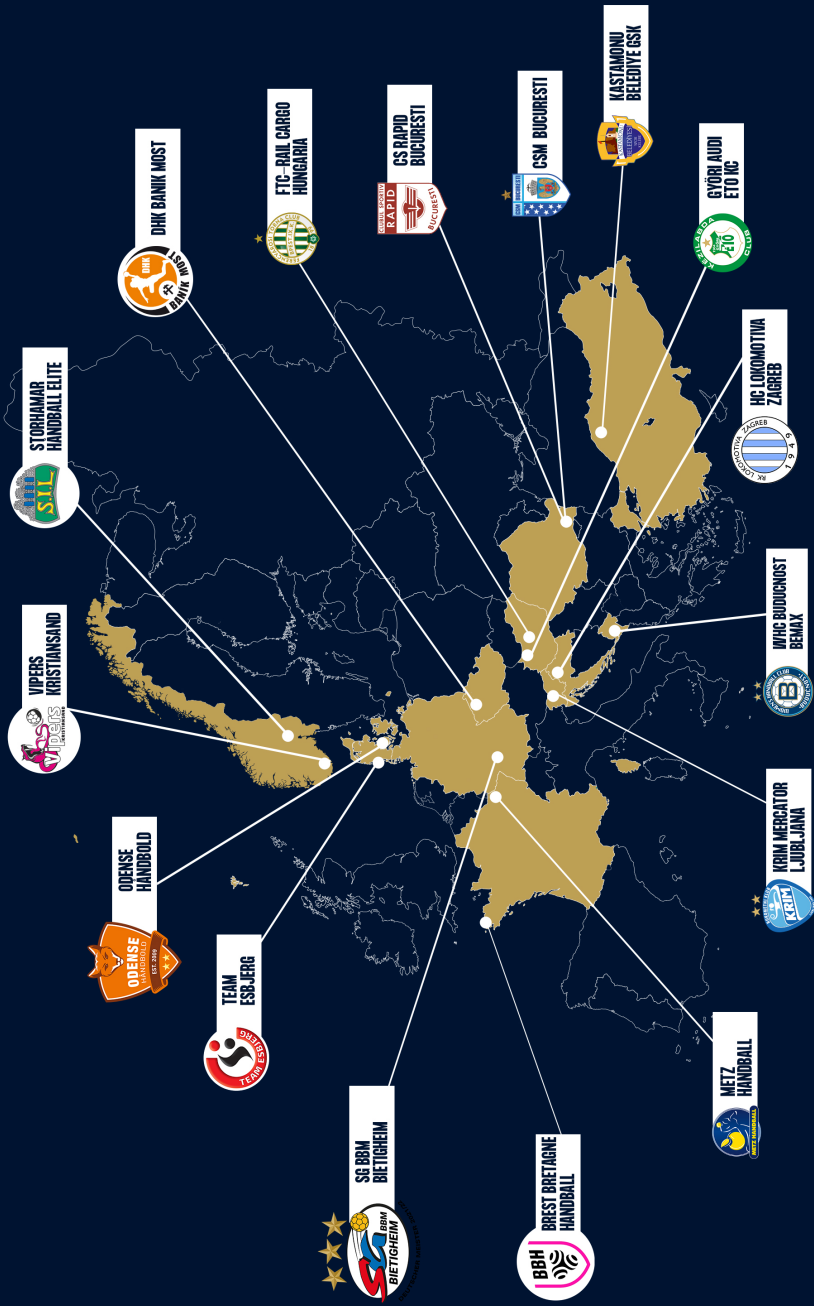

I EHF FINAL4 WOMEN 2023 LINE-UP

The four teams competing for the trophy at the EHF FINAL4 Women 2023 on 3/4 June at MVM Dome in Budapest make for an interesting blend.

Titleholders Vipers Kristiansand return to Budapest after a 71:56 aggregate win in the quarter-final against CS Rapid Bucuresti. Five-time champions Györi Audi ETO KC had two wins against Odense Håndbold (29:27, 37:28).

Team Esbjerg earned their second EHF FINAL4 berth for the second time in a row at the cost of CSM Bucuresti (65:59) and FTC-Rail Cargo will have their maiden trip to the event courtesy of their shocking away win at Metz with which they made up for the home defeat (26:32, 33:26).

I BUDAPEST – A PLACE TO MAKE HISTORY

The EHF FINAL4 Women 2023 is the culmination of the women European club handball season. The two-day event sees the best four teams in Europe playing to decide the ultimate winner of the EHF Champions League Women. Introduced in the 2013/14 season the decision to follow the format of the men's version of the competition and create a tournament for the final phase was seen as crucial for the growth of women's handball across Europe. The aim was to create a flagship event, one that could compete on the international sports market and make Europe's leading club competition even more attractive to fans, partners and sponsors.

RECORD-BREAKING EVENT

The success of all previous editions of the EHF FINAL4 up to date shows that this format has been the right strategy. It has set new standards in organisation and entertainment; as it is not just four games played over two days but a true entertainment event! And last season fits perfectly in that picture, as the EHF FINAL4 Women 2022 in Budapest showcased four thrilling matches inside the newly built MVM Dome in Budapest. No fewer than 15,400 spectators attended the matches in the Hungarian capital for the final clash of Vipers Kristiansand against the five-time trophy holders Györi Audi ETO KC (33:31), setting an all-time attendance record for women's club handball. The 2023 event is on track to break even bigger records and players, teams, fans and guest from all across Europe can look forward to an electric atmosphere. The MVM Dome will provide state-of-art facilities for the event and is expected to create a great stage for the highlight event of the EHF Champions League Women season.

OPENING PARTY AND FAN ZONE

Handball fans will already be able to get in a celebratory mood when the EHF FINAL4 Opening Party starts in the fan zone in front of the MVM Dome on Friday 2 June. Everyone attending will be treated to a special programme which includes the official presentations of all four teams on stage, starting at 18:00*. The team presentation of Györi Audi ETO KC will be followed by Vipers Kristiansand (18:30), Team Esbjerg (19:00) and FTC-Rail Cargo Hungaria (19:30).

The fan zone, which will be open throughout the entire weekend, features multiple fun activities. At the SELECT SPORT speed goal handball talents can test the new official match balls and measure their own shooting power. The UNIQA selfie cam presents fans with the opportunity to cheer on their favourite team and be featured on the cube inside the MVM Dome, and of course, visitors can get their hands on the official EHF FINAL4 merchandise.

I NEW BALL DESIGN MAKES ITS DEBUT

The SELECT SPORT match balls for the upcoming 2023/24 season of the EHF Champions League have been revealed earlier this season and will make its official debut at the EHF FINAL4 Women 2023 in Budapest. The balls feature a bold gold design inspired by the coveted EHF Champions League trophy. The iconic pattern of the EHF Champions League trophy is mirrored in the golden print on the ball. As in previous seasons the ball will be the same for the men's and women's competition. FANMADE HISTORY DESIGN COMES TO LIFE

The official EHF FINAL4 2023 merchandise line will not only be for the fans, but also by the fans as Giulia, a creative mind from Germany, was announced as winner of the fanmade history design contest this season. EHF Marketing GmbH and its official sports supplier, the Danish sports and fashion brand hummel, conducted a design contest, calling on handball fans and artists to submit their creative ideas to be used for this year's official merchandise for the marquee events of the EHF Champions League season – the EHF FINAL4 Women 2023 in Budapest and the TruckScout24 EHF FINAL4 2023 in Cologne.

Sketches, drawings and designs were entered from across Europe before the seven best designs made it to the fan voting phase, in which more than 1,200 votes were cast to decide the winner. The winning artwork was now turned into the final design. I GYÖR ON TOP OF THE RANKINGS, DUO AIM FOR THEIR SEVENTH TROPHY

FACTS AND FIGURES: ALL THE NUMBERS YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE THE EHF FINAL4 WOMEN

After a historic result in the EHF Champions League Women quarter-finals, the EHF FINAL4 Women could see its first-ever national derby in the MVM Dome in Budapest on 3 and 4 June 2023, with Hungarian sides FTC-Rail Cargo Hungaria and Györi Audi ETO KC both in the running. The two local teams will be joined by Nordic sides Vipers Kristiansand and Team Esbjerg, both back for another year in the final tournament. Here are the facts and figures from the quarter-finals.

0 teams arrive unbeaten at Budapest this year. Vipers were defeated twice, Györ and Esbjerg three times, and FTC lost seven matches on their way to the EHF FINAL4

0 draws occurred in the quarter-finals, but there were three home and five away victories

1 - for the first time ever since the implementation of the Women's EHF FINAL4 in Budapest, two teams from the same country are part of it: Györ and FTC from Hungary

1 – for the first time, FTC qualified for the EHF FINAL4, which takes place close to their home arena

1

team has won the EHF Champions League Women three times in a row: Györ, from 2017 until 2019. Vipers have the chance to do the same after winning the trophy in 2021 and 2022

1 goal was the closest overall margin in the quarter-finals: FTC beat Metz Handball 59:58 on aggregate

2 teams which qualified for the EHF FINAL4 made it through the play-offs (Esbjerg and FTC). Vipers and Györ directly qualified for the quarter-finals. Esbjerg won all four knock-out matches

2 former Champions League winners, representing seven trophies, are still part of the competition: Vipers (2021, 2022) and Györ (2013, 2014, 2017, 2018, 2019)

2 previous EHF FINAL4 participants were eliminated in the quarter-finals: 2016 winners CSM, and Metz

2

teams from Bucharest qualified for the quarter-finals, both failed to progress: CSM Bucuresti (against Esbjerg) and CS Rapid Bucuresti (against Vipers)

2 players – Jovanka Radicevic and Cristina Neagu – scored their 1,000th Champions League goals during the group phase

2 players still in the competition could win their seventh trophy: Katrine Lunde (Vipers) and Nora Mørk (Esbjerg). Last year, they tied the record for the largest number of titles in history for a single player with current WHC Buducnost BEMAX coach Bojana Popovic and Ausra Fridrikas

3 former or current female IHF World Players of the Year are part of the semi-finals: Andrea Lekic (FTC/2013), Sandra Toft (2021) and Stine Oftedal (2019/both Györ)

3 teams won both quarter-final legs: Györ, Esbjerg and Vipers

3 of the four EHF FINAL4 participants were part of the event in 2022: Vipers, Györ and Esbjerg

3 quarter-final matches were attended by 5,000 or more fans: the home games of Györ, Rapid and CSM

4 countries and four clubs have been represented by the eight EHF FINAL4 winners so far: Hungary (four/Györ), Norway (two/Vipers), Montenegro (Buducnost) and Romania (CSM)

6 goals was the biggest deficit turned around by a team in the knockout phase since the introduction of the EHF FINAL4 format. FTC's ousting of Metz with a seven-goal second-leg win beat the five-goal margin by CSKA vs CSM in 2021

7 years – the length of time that Györ did not lose a Champions League home match, before the 24:28 defeat by Metz in September

8 – Győr have qualified for the eighth time for the EHF FINAL4 in Budapest. They missed the event only once, in 2015. Vipers have their fourth straight appearance at Budapest, Esbjerg their second consecutive participation

8 of the 128 matches this season ended in draws

9 goals was the biggest margin in a single quarter-final match, twice: Győr vs Odense (37:28) and Vipers vs Rapid (40:31)

7

7 matches of the 2022/23 season, but zero in the play-offs or the quarter-finals, ended with a margin of 20 or more goals

10 – 70 or more goals were scored in 10 matches this season, including one quarter-final

11 nations represent the previous winners of the EHF Champions League: Denmark, Hungary (six titles each), Austria (four), Norway (three), Slovenia (two), Montenegro (two), North Macedonia, Spain, Croatia, Russia and Romania (one each)

14 different clubs were or will be part of the EHF FINAL4 events: Győr (7x), Vardar (5), Buducnost (4), Vipers (4), CSM (3), Esbjerg (2), Metz (2), Rostov-Don (2), FC Midtjylland, Volgograd, Larvik, CSKA, Brest and FTC (all once)

15 goals was the biggest overall margin in the quarter-finals: Vipers vs Rapid 71:56 on aggregate

16 times in 128 games – including one quarter-final (Vipers vs Rapid, 40:31) – a team scored 40 or more goals in a single game

25 goals was the biggest margin since the start of the group phase (Metz vs Lokomotiva 38:13)

32 matches – 3 quarter-finals and play-offs and 26 group phase – were attended by 3,000 or more fans

41 goals in the group match between FTC and Brest (20:21) is the lowest score of the season

47 goals were scored by Bietigheim in the group match against DHK Banik Most (47:25) to level the all-time high score in this competition, when HC Vardar beat Krim Mercator Ljubljana 47:29 in 2015

50 times – four times in the quarter-finals, once in the play-offs and 45 times in the group phase –

the fans saw 60 and more goals

51 times – five times in the quarter-finals, three times in the play-offs and 43 times in the group phase – the away team was the winner.

56 goals was the lowest score in the quarter-finals, when Vipers won 31:25 at Rapid and in Győr's 29:27 away win at Odense

68 times – three times in the quarter-finals, four times in the play-offs and 61 times in the group phase – the home team was victorious

71 goals was the highest score in a single quarter-final match, when Vipers beat Rapid 40:31

130 goals (including nine in the quarter-finals) have been scored by Henny Reistad (Esbjerg) to be the current top scorer of the competition

204 victories in 270 matches lift Győr on top of the all-time Champions League table. The record winners also have 20 draws and 46 defeats on their tally. Győr became the first ever team with 200 wins in the competition in the 2022/23 season

300 – Krim and Buducnost became the first ever teams to play 300 Champions League matches in their club history in the 2022/23 season

489 goals were scored in the eight quarter-final matches, an average of 61.2 per match, compared to only 424 goals in the eight play-off matches

1,069 goals in 19 Champions League seasons were scored by Jovanka Radicevic (Krim) to be the all-time top scorer, ahead of Cristina Neagu (1,028). Both passed previous top scorer Anita Görbicz (Győr/1,016) in the 2022/23 season

- these will be Ambros Martin's last two games for Györ, as the Spanish coach, now at his eighth appearance in the EHF FINAL4, will leave at the end of the season
- the Hungarian side lost three matches in the group phase and finished second, but sealed a clear 66:55 aggregate win against Odense in the quarter-finals
- the Hungarian champions have scored 31.8 goals per game on average, but their defence has been carrying the load, as they conceded only 25.1 goals per game this season, the best average in the CL
- their top scorer right back Ana Gros, who returned after 10 years to the Hungarian side, as Gros, the sixth scorer all-time in the CL added 87 goals this season
- despite not making more than 205 saves this season, Györ's goalkeeping department has been the second best in the CL, with the 33.7% saving efficiency placing them second, only behind Vipers
- if Györ win the title, Martin will win the fifth CL trophy and the Hungarian side their sixth, widening the gap as the most decorated coach and team in the CL history
- Vipers have the best attack in terms of the average number of goals scored per game this season, 32.9, with the main responsibility being held by Markéta Jeřábková, Anna Vyakhireva and Jamina Roberts combining for 247 goals
- the Norwegian side can become only the second team in the CL history to win the title in three consecutive seasons after Györi Audi ETO KC
- their goalkeepers registered the largest number of saves so far in the competition, 230, despite playing two games less than four other teams, with the excellent saving efficiency - 34.9%
- in six matches played in the EHF FINAL4, throughout three editions of the competition, Vipers have lost only one game, 22:31, against Györ in the 2018/19 semi-finals
- the MVP of the last season's event, Jerabkova, has been their top scorer so far, with 107 goals, one of the four players to score in triple digits this season
- from the teams qualified to the EHF FINAL4 this season, Vipers have the third-best scoring efficiency, 64.4%, boasting a 527-goal tally from 818 shots
- Vipers' goalkeeper, Katrine Lunde, can become the first player in the CL history to win seven titles, as she won two each with Viborg, Györ and Vipers

- after failing at the last hurdle for four seasons in a row, FTC have finally made it to the EHF FINAL4 for the first time in their history
- they are the team with the largest number of losses still alive in the competition, conceding seven losses in the 18 games they played this season, which is the new CL record
- with an average number of goals per game of 28.9, Ferencváros have scored the lowest number of goals from all EHF FINAL4 teams
- FTC made it through to the EHF FINAL4 after one of the biggest shocks in the CL history, cancelling a six-goal home loss against Metz Handball to take a 33:26 win in the second
- defensively FTC have been excellent this season, conceding 26.5 goals per game, the second lowest number between the semi-finalists, after Győr
- their top scorer, Katrin Klujber, is one of the four players to have scored in triple digits, her 106 goal-tally being the fourth largest in the season
- no player has blocked more shots than FTC's defensive stalwart Zsuzsanna Tomori, with 18 blocks in 15 matches, or an average of 1.2 blocks per game
- no team has scored more goals than Esbjerg this season, with the Danish side boasting a 575-goal tally in 18 matches, as their attack has been the focal point of their success
- the Danish side has conceded four losses this season, but are coming in red hot to Budapest, having won the last four games in the knockout phases of the CL
- they are on a 21-game winning streak in all competitions, their last loss came in February, in the last group phase game at Győr (28:29)
- they boast the best scorer of the season so far, back Henny Reistad, who scored 130 goals in 18 matches, 12 goals more than any other player in the competition
- Reistad only needs 10 goals in the two matches scheduled in Budapest to become the all-time top scorer in the history of the EHF FINAL4, with the record currently held by Nycke Groot and Anita Görbicz
- they have not lost by more than two goals this season and aim to become the first Danish side to clinch a place in the EHF FINAL4 final after both themselves and FC Midtjylland failed to win their semi-final in 2014 and 2022 respectively
- if Esbjerg win the crown, right back Nora Mørk will become the first player in history to secure the CL title seven times

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THERE IS A DRAW AFTER THE SECOND HALF

All matches of the EHF FINAL4 shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes with a half-time break of 15 mins.

If a Semi-final match or the Final (place 1/2) ends in a draw, there will be a five-minute break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes, there will be a one minute half-time break for the change-over of teams.

If the 3/4 placement match ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time, the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five players eligible to play at the end of the match by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.
- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the Game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.
- At the Technical Meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).
- In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.
- Eligible players are players entered in the match report that have not been disqualified or suspended at the time of the final whistle.
- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

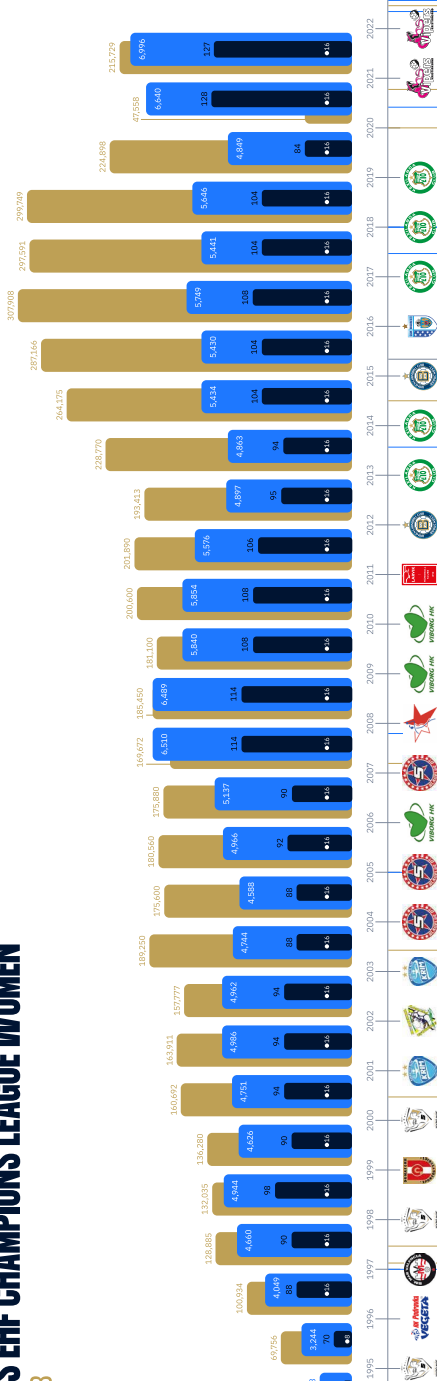
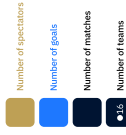
