I GENERAL MEDIA INFORMATION

Welcome to the eighth EHF FINAL4 Women in Budapest. Through the media information services we keep you up to date with all news and provide resources for your coverage.

Accreditations

You can pick up your accreditation in the accreditation centre. The accreditation centre is located at gate XI of MVM Dome (Üllői út 131, 1098 Budapest), just in front of the TV compound.

Opening hours of the accreditation centre are:

- Friday, 3 June 2022: 10:00-19:00
- Saturday, 4 June 2022: 10:00-19:00
- Sunday, 5 June 2022: 10:00-18:00

At the accreditation pick-up, you must present a copy of the accreditation email and a valid photo ID (e.g. passport or driving licence) in order to collect your accreditation.

Covid-19 measures

The EHF Hygiene Concept for club competitions will be followed during the EHF FINAL4 Women 2022. The latest version of the EHF Hygiene Concept foresees that anyone who comes in a close contact with players must be either vaccinated (V), recovered (R), or tested (T). If a person does not meet any of these VRT conditions, a FFP2 mask must be worn.

Parking

Media parking spaces at MVM Dome are limited and will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.

Media representatives that would like to reserve a media parking space must contact presscentre-hungary@gmail.com and specify the days for which parking space is required.

After the reservation, you will receive a PDF document that needs to be printed and presented to security on Friday 3 June. For Saturday 4 and Sunday 5 June, QR codes will be issued. The QR code is valid for one entry.

Media centre

The media centre opens its doors on Friday and remains open until Sunday. It will have an info desk, working area, and catering area. The opening hours are as follows:

- Friday, 3 June 2022: 13:00-18:00
- Saturday, 4 June 2022: 11:00-22:30
- Sunday, 5 June 2022: 11:00-22:30

Catering

Media catering will be divided into two categories – snacks and hot meals.

Snacks will be available for free in the media centre during the day and include hot and cold drinks, mini sandwiches, fruit and mini pastries.

Hot meals will also be available in the media catering area on Saturday and on Sunday from 16:30 until 19:00. Hot meals must have been ordered in advance.

Media seating

Media seats will be located in sectors 202 and 203 on the second floor of MVM Dome. Please note that media cannot book a position in the media tribune.

Photographers

Photographers can pick up their photo bibs from the info desk in the media centre. A small deposit (20€/6000 HUF) will be required on arrival to ensure the return of the bibs after the event.

Photo positions are located behind the goals; photographers can only access them if they wear their accreditation and bib. Photographers must take their places in the photo positions ahead of the start of each game. It is mandatory to remain seated during a match and it is forbidden to enter the field of play.

Changing sides is only possible at half-time and it is forbidden to cross the field of play to do so: the adequate routing will be presented in the photo briefing.

If needed, a photo positions plan may be implemented. Photographers cannot book or reserve a photo position. Priority will be given to EHF photographers, major agencies, team photographers, and national media of the teams playing.

Photo briefings are on Saturday and Sunday, both at 14:00 in the media centre.

Media calls

Media calls take place in the Ensana Thermal Margitsziget Health Spa Hotel (Margitsziget, 1007 Budapest). Media representatives are kindly asked to use the main entrance to the hotel; volunteers at the info desk will guide them to the Magnolia room, where the media calls take place.

There are 30 parking spots for media available at the hotel on a first-come-first-served basis. Media representatives are kindly asked to get in touch with the volunteers at the info desk regarding the parking.

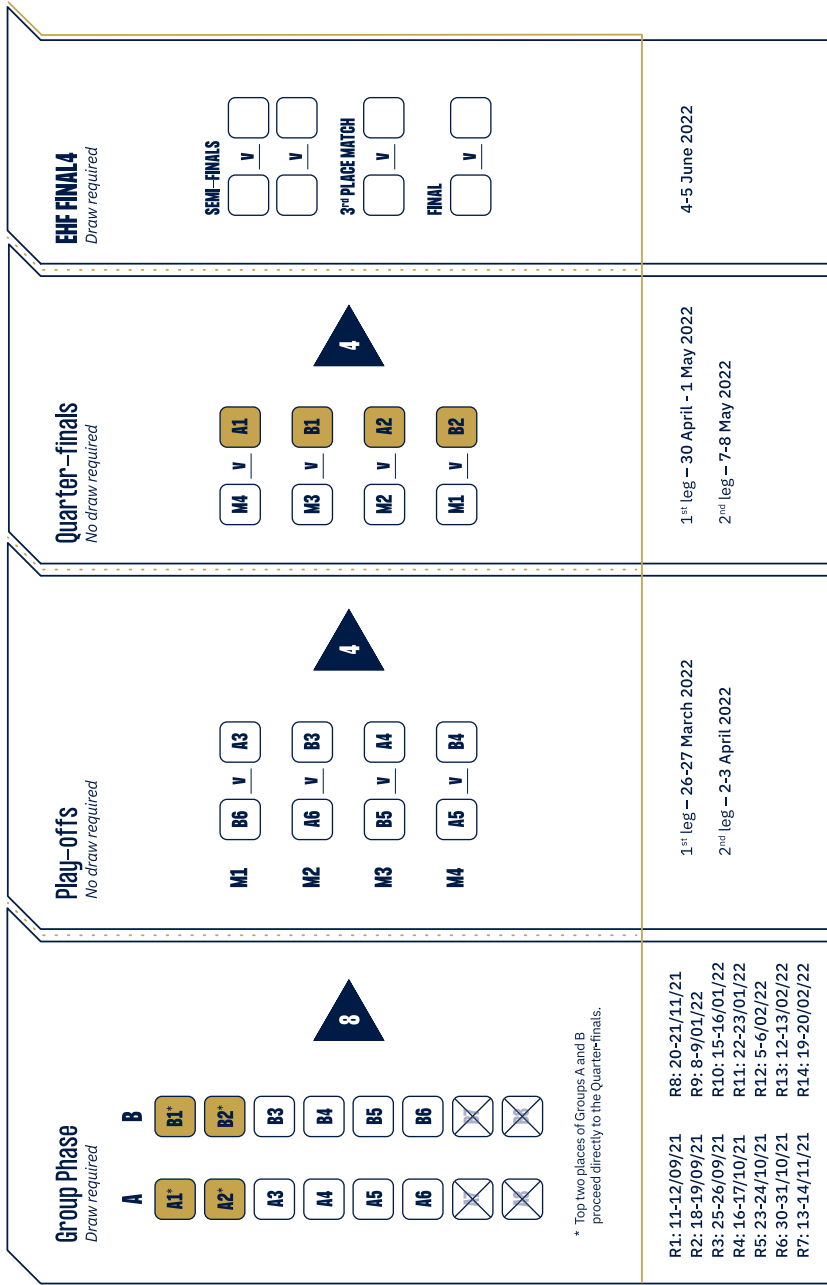

I EHF FINAL4 WOMEN 2022 LINE-UP

The four teams competing for the trophy at the EHF FINAL4 Women 2022 on 4/5 June at MVM Dome in Budapest make for an interesting blend.

Titleholders Vipers Kristiansand return to Budapest after a 65:49 aggregate win in the quarter-final against Krim Mercator Ljubljana. Five-time champions Györi Audi ETO KC had a draw (21:21) and a big win (35:23) against the team that beat them in the semi-finals last year, Brest Bretagne Handball.

Metz Handball skipped the quarter-finals and advanced to the EHF FINAL4 directly from the play-offs as quarter-final opponents Rostov-Don could not compete amid the suspension of Russian teams from EHF competitions. Team Esbjerg earned their first EHF FINAL4 berth with a 53:52 aggregate win over CSM Bucuresti.



I GYÖR ON TOP OF THE RANKINGS, TRIO AIM FOR THEIR SIXTH TROPHY

FACTS AND FIGURES: ALL THE NUMBERS YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE THE EHF FINAL4 WOMEN

Four matches are ahead, 123 have been played. Győr and Esbjerg at 15:15 CEST and Metz and Vipers at 18:00 CEST meet in the semi-finals at MVM Dome on Saturday 4 June.

Here are facts and figures you need to know prior to those matches. Record winners Győr top almost every ranking – except the top scorers list. And EHF FINAL4 debutants Esbjerg are the 13th different club to qualify for the EHF FINAL4 Women.

0 teams arrive unbeaten at the 2022 edition of the EHF FINAL4 in Budapest

0 teams from the same country will face at the EHF FINAL4 in Budapest, as four countries are represented

0 times since the first EHF FINAL4 Women was held in 2014, two teams from the same country have qualified

0 teams have been part of all seven previous EHF FINAL4 Women tournaments; record winners Győr lead this ranking, having qualified for the seventh time in 2022

0

teams arriving from the play-offs in the quarter-finals have qualified for the EHF FINAL4

1 debutant will be part of the eighth EHF FINAL4 in Budapest: Team Esbjerg – after FC Midtjylland (2014) the second team from Denmark to make it to the final tournament of the EHF Champions League Women

1 defeat only in 16 matches was conceded by both Győr and Esbjerg; Metz and Vipers both lost four times on their way to Budapest

1 team skipped the quarter-finals and directly qualified for the EHF FINAL4: Metz, as their quarter-final opponents Rostov-Don, like all Russian teams, have been suspended by the EHF

1 team won both quarter-final matches: defending champions Vipers beat Krim twice

1 goal was the smallest winning margin in the quarter-finals: Esbjerg defeated CSM Bucuresti 53:52 on aggregate

time only, Győr have missed the EHF FINAL4 – in 2015; once qualified, they missed the final just once, after losing the semi-final to Brest in 2021

1 team have won the trophy at the EHF FINAL4 in consecutive years: Győr won in 2017, 2018, and 2019, making them the only team to win two, let alone three titles in a row; in 2022, defending champions Vipers hope for their second straight triumph, after lifting the trophy in 2021

1 EHF FINAL4 debutant so far have managed to win the trophy: CSM Bucuresti in 2016, when they beat Győr in the final after a penalty shootout; in 2022, Esbjerg can become the second team to achieve the feat

2 former EHF Champions League winners (including all since 2017) are part of the semi-finals: Vipers and Győr; former winners Krim and CSM were eliminated in the quarter-finals

2 former IHF World Players of the Year are part of the EHF FINAL4 Women in 2022: the Norwegians Heidi Løke (Kristiansand/2011) and Stine Oftedal (Győr/2019)

2 times have Metz qualified for the EHF FINAL4: for the first time in 2019, when finished fourth; for the second time in 2022

2 quarter-final matches ended in a draw: Brest vs Győr (21:21) and Esbjerg vs CSM (27:27)

3 players aim for their sixth EHF Champions League trophy: Vipers trio Katrine Lunde, Heidi Løke and Nora Mørk

3 EHF FINAL4 participants shared the same group earlier this season: Győr, Vipers and Metz all played in group B; Esbjerg advanced from group A

4 countries are represented by the seven EHF FINAL4 winners so far: Hungary (four times), Montenegro, Romania and Norway

10 of 123 matches since the start of the group phase have ended in a draw; none in the play-offs, two in the quarter-finals

matches so far this season featured 45 or fewer goals; none in the play-offs and one in the quarter-finals:
Brest vs Győr 21:21

11 nations represent the previous winners of the EHF Champions League: Denmark, Hungary (6 titles each), Austria (4), Slovenia (2), Montenegro (2), Norway (2), North Macedonia, Spain, Croatia, Russia and Romania (1 title each)

12 goals was the biggest winning margin in a quarter-final match: Győr vs Brest 35:23

13 different clubs were or are part of the seven previous EHF FINAL4 events: Győr (7 times), Vardar (5), Buducnost (4), CSM (3), Kristiansand (3), Rostov (2), Metz (2), Midtjylland, Volgograd, Larvik, CSKA, Brest and Esbjerg (1 all).

16 matches have been played by each of the EHF FINAL4 participants: Metz skipped the quarter-finals; Győr, Esbjerg and Vipers skipped the play-offs; the group phase included 14 rounds

24 goals were the biggest margin since the start of the group phase, when Dortmund beat Podravka 38:14; the biggest gap in the play-offs was 13 goals, when Metz beat Dortmund 32:19; the biggest gap in the quarter-finals was 12 goals, when Győr beat Brest 35:23

25 times in 123 matches so far this season, the winning margin has been 10 or more goals; once in the play-offs (Metz vs Dortmund 32:19), once in the quarter-finals (Győr vs Brest 35:23)

29 points from 16 matches is Győr's tally so far this season; Esbjerg (26 points), Vipers (24) and Metz (23) follow

39 was the lowest amount of goals in a single match, when FTC won 20:19 at Rostov; in the play-offs this amount was 48 (FTC vs Krim 26:22); in the quarter-finals it was 42 (Brest vs Győr 21:21)

43 home matches – including the 35:22 win in the quarter-final against Brest – is the length of Győr's unbeaten run in the EHF Champions League, since 21:26 defeat against FC Midtjylland in November 2015

49 times in 123 matches the away team won; only one in the play-offs (Metz at Dortmund), and twice in the quarter-finals (Esbjerg at CSM, and Vipers at Krim)

65 of the 123 matches were won by the home team; only two in the quarter-finals: Győr against Brest, and Vipers against Krim

69 was the highest amount of goals in a single match this season, and the best mark has been reached twice, each time involving Metz: they lost 39:30 at Győr, and won 38:31 against Odense; 59 goals was the highest amount in a play-off match (Krim vs FTC 33:26); 58 in the quarter-finals (Győr vs Brest 35:23)

110 goals make CSM left back Cristina Neagu the top scorer of the 2021/22 season so far; the best scorer still in competition is Vipers right back Nora Mørk, with 96 goals

398 goals conceded for both Győr and Esbjerg make them the best defences among the four EHF FINAL4 participants, ahead of Metz (416) and Vipers (419)

527 goals have been scored by Győr so far this season, an average of 32.93 goals per match; Vipers have scored 502 goals, Metz 475, and Esbjerg 465

319 goals were scored in six quarter-final matches, an average of 53.16 per match

6,712 goals have been scored in 111 group matches (6,079), six play-off matches (314), and six quarter-final matches (319); the average per match for the season so far is 54.67 goals

- Györ qualified for the seventh time in eighth editions for the EHF FINAL4 in Budapest, winning the title four times, boasting 10 wins and two losses
- Esbjerg, who have played only 56 games in the EHF Champions League Women, will be fighting for the trophy at the EHF FINAL4 for the first time
- the Hungarian powerhouse has the best attack in the competition with an average of 32.9 goals per game, while their defence has conceded the fewest goals per game: 24.8 on average.
- the MVP of last season's EHF FINAL4, Norwegian back Henny Reistad, is Esbjerg's top scorer this season, putting 86 goals past the opponents; Györ's top scorer Stine Oftedal has scored 54 goals so far this season
- no other player has a better average of goals scored per game at the EHF FINAL4 than Reistad, who scored 30 times in four games, being the 10th best scorer in the history of the tournament
- the two teams finished first in their respective groups in the group phase, being the sides with the lowest amount of losses in the competition this season – one each
- Esbjerg are coming into the EHF FINAL4 after losing the play-offs for the Danish domestic title to Odense Handbold: they lost 25:24 on Tuesday and the best-of-three series 2-1
- the two sides have met only twice in the EHF Champions League Women: Györ clearly won both duels in the 2016/17 season: 32:26 and 33:22

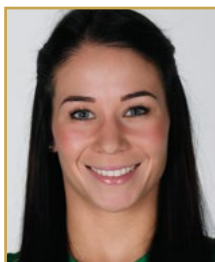

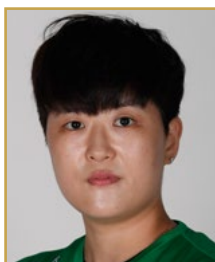

- Vipers became the first Norwegian team to qualify for the EHF FINAL4 for three times in a row, after finishing third in the 2018/19 season and winning the title in the 2020/21 season
- Metz are back at the EHF FINAL4 for the second time, after finishing fourth in 2019, when they lost against Rostov-Don and Vipers Kristiansand
- Vipers' right back Nora Mørk needs 14 goals in the last two games of the season to tie Romanian left back Cristina Neagu in the top scorer standings, after putting 96 goals past the opposing goalkeepers prior to the EHF FINAL4
- Metz are the only side to appear in the play-offs this season (where they beat BV Borussia 09 Dortmund), as Győr, Vipers and Esbjerg all finished in the top two of their respective group
- both teams became champions in their domestic leagues: Vipers took a 53:40 aggregate win in the final against Storhamar Handball Elite; Metz Handball clinched a 49:48 aggregate win against Brest Bretagne Handball
- the reigning champions won only twice in the next season's semi-finals: Győr in 2018 and 2019, with three other titleholders conceding losses and failing to retain their title
- the two sides met twice this season, with Metz winning both encounters: 23:18 and 31:25, as Vipers dropped half of the four games they lost against their semi-finals opponents

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN TWO OR MORE TEAMS HAVE THE SAME NUMBER OF POINTS

All matches of the EHF FINAL4 shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes with a half-time break of 15 mins.

If a Semi-final match or the Final (place 1/2) ends in a draw, there will be a five-minute break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes, there will be a one minute half-time break for the change-over of teams.

If the 3/4 placement match ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time, the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five players eligible to play at the end of the match by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.
- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the Game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.
- At the Technical Meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).
- In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.
- Eligible players are players entered in the match report that have not been disqualified or suspended at the time of the final whistle.
- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

I ALL-STAR TEAM 2021/22

Four Györi Audi ETO KC players, plus their coach Ambros Martin, have been named to the EHF Champions League Women All-star Team 2021/22, with Stine Oftedal winning her fourth consecutive spot. Centre back Oftedal is joined on the All-star Team not just by coach Martin, but also goalkeeper Laura Glauser, line player Linn Blohm and best defender Kari Brattset Dale.

It is the fourth year in a row that Oftedal has been named as All-star Team centre back for the Champions League. A number of other players are also regular All-star Team members. CSM Bucuresti's Cristina Neagu makes her seventh appearance, after nominations from 2015 to 2018, and in 2020 and 2021. Vipers Kristiansand's Nora Mørk is named All-star right back for a fifth time, after 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2021. Martin becomes the best coach for the fifth time, following his previous appearances between 2015 and 2018.

Team Esbjerg left wing Sanna Solberg-Isaksen makes her second appearance in the line-up, after 2020, as does best young player Pauletta Foppa. Foppa was the best line player last year when Brest Bretagne Handball reached the EHF FINAL4. The rest of this year's All-star Team appear for the first time, with inaugural nominations for Glauser, Blohm and Brattset Dale as well as right wing Angela Malestein of FTC-Rail Cargo Hungaria.

Most of the All-star Team will be stepping on court at the MVM Dome in Budapest this weekend during the EHF FINAL4, but Malestein, Foppa and Neagu will be absent after their teams were knocked out earlier in the competition. Brattset Dale will also miss this weekend, having recently announced she is pregnant.

After winning the EHF EURO 2020 and the 2021 IHF Women's World Championship, Norway once again prove their strength in women's handball with four of the nine players' nominations: Oftedal, Mørk, Solberg-Isaksen and Brattset Dale. Thousands of fans logged on to the Home of Handball app to make their votes for the team ahead of the final weekend.
